

Dress Code

We believe that the way in which our students dress for school has an effect on the attitude of the students, the seriousness of their learning, as well as the overall culture of the school. As such, we will be strictly enforcing the dress code. Neat, comfortable and modest dress (*tzniut*) is part of good *chinuch*. Our dress code is intended to reflect an understanding that YCQ is a *makom Torah* where *tzniut* considerations, for both boys and girls, are a primary concern. The Yeshiva will strictly enforce the dress code policies from the first day of school. We look to you, the parents, as our partners in the enforcement of the dress code of our Yeshiva; we thank you in advance for your careful attention, in your child's cooperation to make this a success.

Since no set of rules can anticipate every eventuality of style, the judgment of the administration on attire not specifically covered in the code will be the final word.

GIRLS

Skirts: All skirts must fully cover the knees when sitting or standing, front and back. Skirt slits may not extend above the knee. All skirts must be of appropriate fit, not tight or form fitting.

Shirts: Shirts must be long enough so that no midriff is exposed when standing, sitting or as a result of regular movement. Girls cannot wear sleeves shorter than those that approach the elbow (i.e., no shorter than one inch above the elbow); shirts must reach the collarbone, including layering tank tops or shells. Low-cut and tight shirts may not be worn. Shirts may not be see-through and sleeves must cover the entire upper arm (when your hand is raised as well).

Shoes: No open toe shoes.

Hair: Hair may not be dyed to unnatural color, or be multiple colors that do not look natural.

Make-up should not be worn unless it is in honor of Rosh Chodesh!

Every Friday and Rosh Chodesh– White shirts and blue (or black) skirts.

BOYS

Pants: Solid colors only, appropriately fitted (i.e., not tight). Absolutely NO jeans or denim pants are allowed in school. **No skinny jeans.** Pants that are "jeans style" are NOT permitted. Pants must have side pockets and no denim stitching or jean style metal studs.

Shirts: Shirts must have collars. Insignias are acceptable, inappropriate logos may not be worn. All shirt buttons must be closed except for the top button, so that no undershirt is exposed.

Tzizit and Kippot: These items must be worn at all times.

Hair: Hair must be cut to proper length for our Yeshiva.

Shoes and Socks: No sandals. Socks are required at all times.

Every Friday and Rosh Chodesh -- White shirts and blue (or black) pants.
